THE RESIDENTIAL COMMUNITY OF THE AMERICAN ACADEMY IN ROME

Since 1894, the American Academy in Rome has offered artists and scholars the unparalleled opportunity of time and space to live and work in a supportive community in Rome. Today we award approximately 30 Rome Prize Fellowships, of six months to two years duration following a national competition which attracts 800 to 1,000 applications annually. Joining the Rome Prize Fellows is a small number of senior artists and scholars, invited by the Academy Director to be Residents, each for a period of two to four months. Many of America's leading artists and scholars have passed through our gates as Fellows or Residents, and they count their time at the Academy as critical to their careers and work.

Each year the Academy's community also includes a number of Affiliated Fellows: artists and scholars who have been selected and are supported by organizations in cooperation with the Academy, including Member Institutions. Additionally the Academy hosts Visiting Artists and Scholars who, by application, rent living and work space at the Academy for a short period of time. The Academy's residential community of Fellows, Residents, Affiliated Fellows and Visiting Artists and Scholars numbers 125 individuals at any time.

MEMBER INSTITUTIONS OF THE AMERICAN ACADEMY IN ROME

There are over 100 universities and arts and cultural organizations in the United States, Europe, the Middle East and North Africa who participate as Member Institutions. Membership enables institutions to award an Affiliated Fellowship at the Academy, for an additional fee and at mutually-agreed-upon dates. Other benefits extend opportunities to faculty members, staff, trustees and friends.

The cost to become a Member Institution in the American Academy in Rome is \$1,000 per year.

AFFILIATED FELLOWSHIPS

On a regular basis and by prior agreement, Member Institutions may name an Affiliated Fellow to be in residence at the Academy for four to six weeks. The Affiliated Fellow receives the following:

- Housing (a single room with private bath)
- The right to rent a study or studio, if one is available
- Meals on the same plan as those provided to Rome Prize Fellows and Residents, currently lunch six days a week, and dinner five days a week, except holidays
- The opportunity to attend concerts, conferences, exhibitions, lectures, readings, symposia, trips and tours

- Access to all Academy scholarly resources: Library, Photographic Archive, Antiquities Collection, and Archaeology Room
- The opportunity to engage with the Academy community by scheduling an informal talk or open studio to present their work

Partners and spouses are welcome to join Affiliated Fellows at the Academy if space is available, however the Academy cannot accommodate Affiliated Fellows' children.

DEADLINES

The deadline for submitting intent to send a Fellow is December 31 of the preceding academic year. Criteria for selecting an Affiliated Fellow are at the discretion of the Member Institution.

The deadline for submitting preferred residency dates, and whether or not the Affiliated Fellow will be accompanied by a spouse or partner, is April 30 of the preceding academic year.

FEEES

<u>Affiliated Fellowship Fee:</u>	\$6,500* per four-week period
<u>Studio or Study Fee:</u>	\$1,500* per four-week period, pending availability
<u>Administrative Fee:</u>	\$1,250 per Affiliated Fellow

*Fees are valid for 2015-16 but are subject to change with inflation and exchange rate fluctuations. Additional fees will apply for partner board or travel stipends.

ADDITIONAL ANNUAL BENEFITS

- Invitations to Academy events in the United States and Italy
- Access for faculty members, professional staff, and graduate students to the Library and Photographic Archive of the American Academy in Rome
- Preferential consideration in applications to be Visiting Artists and Scholars at the American Academy in Rome
- Preferential rates for tours of the Academy to be offered to your institution's trustees and donor groups
- Preferential rates once a year to host a program (conference, concert, lecture, etc.) or social event (reception or dinner) at the Academy's landmark Villa Aurelia
